Wyandot Memorial Hospital Foundation Board Member Responsibilities

- 2. **Advocacy:** Foundation board members should serve as ambassadors for the Foundation and Wyandot Memorial Hospital. This may include speaking at public events, meeting with potential donors or partners, and promoting the Foundation on social media.
- 3. **Financial Oversight:** Foundation board members are expected to understand the Foundation's financial position and ensure its financial stability. This includes approving annual budgets, reviewing financial reports, and ensuring the Foundation has adequate resources to fulfill its mission.
- 4. **Strategic Planning:** Foundation board members are responsible for setting the strategic direction of the Foundation. They should participate in strategic planning sessions and review the Foundation's mission, vision, and goals on a regular basis.







The Wyandot Health Foundation, Inc., a wholly-owned sibsidiary of Wyandot Memorial Hospital, is a nonprofit fundraising entity supporting the hospital and its comunities, incorporated as a tax-exempt organization under IRC 501c(3) and IRC 509a(3), with 100% of donations allocated according to donor wishes and expenses covered by the hospital.
